

Biobank refusal

With this biobank refusal form, you can withdraw your consent to the biobank and/or object to the processing of your samples and data in the biobank after the sample has been collected. In addition, you may proactively prohibit the use of your samples and data in biobank research. You may withdraw your consent before the sample is given or, at the latest, before the sample and related information is handed over to the biobank. After withdrawal, your samples will not be collected in the biobank. After a sample has been collected and handed over to the biobank, you may manage the use of your own data or prevent the use of your data in the biobank by using your right to object (Article 21 of the EU General Data Protection Regulation). You may object to the processing of some or all of your personal data. In practice, also partial objection to the processing of personal data results in the prevention of the use of all personal data. Please note that the biobank interprets the withdrawal of consent as also including the exercise of the right to object. Withdrawal and/or objection shall take effect after Biobank Borealis of Northern Finland has received the signed form. After this, your samples and data will no longer be used or provided for new research. Your samples will be destroyed and your data will, as a rule, be removed from the biobank register (except for the information on the ban itself). Any data on your state of health potentially analysed from your biobank sample will also be deleted.
